


The #1 Reason Men Visit a Urologist

BPH stands for Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia, commonly called enlarged prostate. It occurs when the prostate becomes so enlarged that is presses against the urethra. Over time, the bladder wall thickens and eventually weakens.

Common Symptoms of BPH

- Frequent urination 8 or more times per day
- Urinating more often during the night 2 or more times
- Weak or delayed urine stream
- Urinary urgency
- · Dribbling at the end of urination
- · Not being able to fully empty bladder
- Urinary incontinence

BPH is more common than you think. The prostate grows during a man's lifetime. It doubles in size during puberty and enters into another growth phase around the age of 25. It continues to

grow throughout a man's life and if it becomes too enlarged, then issues arise. The causes of BPH are not clear, but hormone changes, such as a decrease in testosterone, may play a role. Luckily, BPH does not raise your risk for prostate cancer, but it can significantly decrease your quality of life and lead to loss of productivity and depression. If left untreated, complications may include chronic urinary retention, urinary tract infections, bladder stones, and damage to the bladder and kidneys.

Who is at risk?

- Men over the age of 40
- Men who are overweight / obese
- Men who lack physical activity
- · Men with a family history of BPH
- Men with heart or circulatory disease or type 2 diabetes

TREATMENT OF BPH

Rezūm™ Water **Vapor Therapy**

Rezūm™ Water Vapor Therapy is a minimally invasive treatment for BPH that uses natural water vapor to reduce the size of the prostate with many years of clinical data to support its effectiveness. Rezūm[™] provides lasting symptom relief without invasive surgery, the need for any permanent implants, or the potential side effects of prescription drugs.

During treatment, natural water is released throughout the targeted prostate tissue. When the steam contacts the tissue and turns back


into water, energy is released, removing the excess prostate cells that squeeze the urethra as the body's natural healing response shrinks the prostate. With the extra tissue removed, the urethra opens, relieving BPH symptoms. Most men experience symptom relief in as soon as two weeks with three to six months to experience the full benefit.

The UROLIFT® System

The Urolift® System is a minimallyinvasive option to treat BPH that preserves sexual function and has fewer side effects than other procedures. A device is used to lift and move the enlarged prostate tissue out of the way so it no longer blocks the urethra. Customized implants are placed to hold the tissue back, leaving an immediate, unobstructed pathway for urine to flow more easily. With the tissue pulled back, the urethra opens, relieving BPH symptoms.



Urolift® does not require heating, cutting, or destruction of the prostate tissue, which means minimal side effects such as pain. The procedure is intended to be a long-lasting solution for BPH that uses small, permanently placed implants. After a mild sedation, patients go home the same day and typically no catheter is required after the procedure. Symptom improvement is demonstrated as early as two weeks and may continue to improve up to three months. Patients experience less frequent need to urinate, a stronger stream with better bladder emptying, and most can stop BPH medications saving on cost and side effects.

With the popularity of organized youth sports on the rise, overuse injuries, also known as one sport injuries, in student athletes have significantly increased in the past several years. Although sports participation can promote healthy, lifelong habits in kids, too much activity can lead to injury, especially when specializing in a single sport. Young athletes are at a greater risk of injury than adults because they are still growing. The effects of overdoing a sport not only includes injury, but could also impair growth and lead to long-term health problems.

Cause

Overuse injuries gradually occur over time. When a child participates in only one sport year-round, they continually use the same muscles while repeatedly putting stress on the same areas of the body. Without proper rest between play, this can lead to muscle imbalances that, when combined with overtraining, greatly increase the risk of overuse injuries.

Symptom

The most common signs of overuse injuries include:

- Pain that cannot be tied to an acute injury, such as a fall.
- The pain often increases with activity and decreases with rest
- Swelling
- Changes in form or technique
- Decreased interest in practice

Prevention

Overuse injuries can easily be prevented. The key is to avoid overdoing any one sport. Here are few ways to prevent overuse injuries:

- Give growing bodies proper time to rest between play
- Limit the number of teams a child plays on in a single season
- Do not play one sport year-round
- Take regular breaks and play other sports

Treatment

If recognized early, finding pain relief from overuse injuries is as simple as resting from the sport. However, if left untreated, overuse injuries can become worse and potentially cause irreversible damage.

Most Common OVERUSE INJURIES in Kids

Overuse injuries can affect muscles, tendons, ligaments, bones, and growth plates. The most common overuse injuries include:

- **Sever's Disease** an inflammatory disease of the growth plate in the heel bone. Running, jumping, and being active lead to repetitive stress on the growth plate resulting in swelling and causing heel pain.
- Jumper's Knee pain that occurs in the lower portion of the kneecap, where the patellar tendon attaches to the kneecap.
 Although more common in sports that involve jumping, such as volleyball, this injury can occur in many different sports.
- Little Leaguer's Elbow pain at the boney bump on the inside of the elbow. This bump, at the end of the humerus bone, contains a growth plate which can become inflamed with too much overhand throwing.
- **Stress Fractures** when muscles become tired and transfer the stress of activity to the bones. Eventually, the bone fails and a small crack develops. Most occur in the lower leg and foot.
- **Strains and Sprains** soft tissue such as muscles, ligaments, and tendons can be injured from overuse.

Avita Health System is in the planning phase of a \$15 million+ cancer center, a cutting-edge facility dedicated to providing comprehensive and compassionate care to patients battling cancer. The center is being designed with the latest advancements in medical technology and patient-centered care to help ensure that

every patient receives the best possible treatment and support on their journey to recovery.

The center will feature a state-of-the-art TrueBeam® linear accelerator, offering the most precise and effective radiation therapy available. This technology targets tumors with pinpoint accuracy, minimizing damage to surrounding

healthy tissue and improving patient outcomes. The center will also house a new PET/CT scanner, a powerful tool that combines the metabolic imaging of PET (positron emission tomography) with the anatomical detail of CT (computed tomography). Radiation therapists will be able to use this tool to more accurately plan

radiation treatments, which will reduce the toxicity of therapy and improve outcomes. This will allow specialists to detect cancer at its earliest stages, assess the extent of disease, and plan and monitor the effectiveness of treatment, all in one visit.

> Along with this new technology, the 20,000+ square foot cancer center will feature a medical oncology clinic, a radiation oncology clinic, 16 infusion bays, a lab, and comprehensive pharmacy services, providing patients with seamless access to their care teams. This integrated approach ensures that patients receive coordinated care with all aspects of

their treatment plan managed under one roof.

The new cancer center is slated to open in late fall of 2025. Approximately 60 new jobs will be added as the center opens and expands on-site support services to patients.




